Transfiguration

So "The Beat Goes On." Not the song written by Sonny Bono and recorded by Sonny & Cher. But the familiar rhythm of the liturgical year. Beginning with the seasons of Advent and Christmas, it takes us through Jesus' earthly journey. The next stop is The Transfiguration of the Lord. (February 19).

What can be said about the Transfiguration story? (Matthew 17:1-13; Mark 9:2-8; Luke 9:28-36). At least two things:

1. Jesus, the Galilean carpenter's son, reveals to three of His followers (Peter, James, and John) that He is the glorious Son of God. Think of mild mannered reporter Clark Kent stepping into a phone booth. (What's a phone booth?) Then stepping out as Superman.

Jesus, hikes up the mountain a carpenter/teacher. Boom! Changed from inside out. "Resplendent with light from God." (2 Peter 1:16-18, Message paraphrase).

2. Jesus wants His followers (that's us) to experience a spiritual transfiguration. This is a process called Sanctification. A big word that means becoming more and more like Jesus. The process starts with a faith connection with Jesus! And continues 24-7-365 until we fall asleep in the Lord.

As we journey with Jesus, yet again, let's pray the words from an old hymn: "Oh! To be like Thee, blessed Redeemer, this is my constant longing and prayer . . ."



From death to new life

After the inventor of the Frisbee died in 2002, family members honored his final wish: to have some of his ashes molded into a flying disk! The point, according to toy legend "Steady Ed" Headrick, was for his loved ones to have fun playing with him even after he had passed. Thankfully, the ashes used on Ash Wednesday aren't cremains. But they do have special significance. They're often made by burning branches from the previous year's Palm Sunday celebration. By tying together seasons, the practice of receiving ashes reminds us of cycles: sin, repentance and forgiveness, plus life, death and resurrection — Jesus' as well as our own.

Session Highlights

Greetings from the Session,

Session met for its regular meeting on January 11, 2023. The meeting began at 6:30 P.M. as a budget meeting to set the 2023 budget. The formal session meeting began at 8:10 P.M. with opening prayer by John and the lighting of the Christ Candle. There was a quorum present and the docket was approved.

The Session acknowledged the death of June Stoller on Dec. 15, 2022. We mourn her passing and celebrate a life well lived. We extend sympathy to her family. There are now 58 on the active roll. Communion was served to 27 on Jan. 1, 2023. The Dec. 14 minutes were approved as read.

Pastor John reported that he had been in contact with several area churches and presbyteries to check on the availability of clergy/lay pastors that might be interested in serving our church in a part time/full time capacity. He had no success. The session will be continuing its search for a permanent pastor and following leads as they come to its attention. John signed his new contract for 6 months with terms the same as last year with the exception of mileage reimbursement. He has also scheduled vacation for 2 weeks in April.

Thank you all who participated, directed and enjoyed the Children's program, Christmas Eve service, caroling, and Christmas brunch during our season of Advent. Our Christmas celebration was wonderful.

With the entering of the new year, our plans are directed to the Lenten/Easter Season beginning February 22, Ash Wednesday. There will daily reading booklets available mid-February. The adult Sunday School will be studying the history of the hymn "Amazing Grace". This hymn is 250 years old and is known worldwide. Please come and study this beautiful, inspirational song on Sundays at 9:30 A.M. starting Feb. 26th.

There will be Lenten Lunches beginning March 1st through Mar 29. Light lunches will be served with a short meditation. A free-will offering will be collected. The proceeds go for Camp Sawtooth Scholarships for our youth camps this summer.

Election of officers will be postponed until a Called Congregational Meeting in February. There are still vacancies to fill i.e., 2 Elder seats (3year terms) and 1 Elder seat (1year term). Please say yes if you are asked to serve!!!!

All staff positions were renewed: Linda Culley – Inside Custodian, Barbra Moore- Office Admin, Paul Pugh – Music Director.

The Session voted to accept

the 2023 budget in the amount of \$111,600. This was over last year's budget of \$108,385. Actual expenditures were \$78,443 for 2022. The higher budget reflects planned expenditures for roof repairs over front door, a new lawn mower and monies for a Pastor Nominating Committee. There are also higher expenditures for day-to-day operations such as electricity and gas.

The Session approved allowing the Boy Scouts to use our church on Thursday evenings and Mt Harrison Quilters meet on 2nd Thursday of each month. If you need to use the church, please schedule by calling the office or checking with Pastor John or any Session member.

Session will meet on February 8 for its next business meeting. All members are welcome to attend Session Meetings. Call the clerk or office to get on the agenda or let us know you want to attend. The meeting adjourned at 9:20 P.M. with prayer.

PRESBYTERY REPORT

Items of interest from the Presbytery:

There will be a called Presbytery Meeting on Feb. 11 to vote on General Assembly proposals and amendments to the Book of Order. I will not be available to attend this meeting. If you are interested in information about these amendments call me and I will send you the link to PC(USA) web site.

The next Stated Presbytery Meeting will be Feb. 25 via Zoom.

The Presbytery is pursuing an inquiry dealing with embezzlements of funds by a presbytery employee.

Church in the Tetons has hired a new temporary pastor – Steve Weber. The church is making progress in sorting out how they are to proceed after the dismissal of their pastor. Pocatello and Soda Springs have temporary lay pastors leading their congregations. Chapel in the Valley is doing well. Twin Falls hired an interim pastor. Hollister and Salmon are struggling for leadership.

The task force to combine E. Oregon, Boise, and Kendall Presbyteries met and is making progress. It will be sometime before this consolidation happens.

There will be 3 meetings this year: Feb. 25 via zoom, June 10 at Soda Springs, Oct 14 at Camp Sawtooth.

What if Christians, individually and as a community, fully embraced *our* new name and identity, sharing radical hospitality and profound joy with everyone? Jesus has bought us from our former owner, sin, and given us a new name: Beloved of God. This identity may seem silly to some, just as the Savannah Bananas raised eyebrows initially. But before long, the delighted fans were going bananas for them!

With the same wild abandon and big-hearted outreach, the church — with its much-greater message — can spread love and goodwill, and have fun doing it!


