Created to Become Like Jesus

The 2023 Lenten journey began Ash Wednesday, February 22. Lent (not lint) is a time to focus on growing spiritually. This Lenten season we will facilitate growing spiritually by looking at God's purposes for our life.

One of God's purposes for creating us is to become like Jesus. In Romans 8:29 the Bible says Christians (that's us) are to be "conformed to the image of his Son."

Country singer Billy Joel has a song that includes these lyrics: "I love you just the way you are!" God the Father also has a song with similar lyrics. It says, "I love you just the way you are. But I love you too much to leave you that way. I want you to be just like my Son."

God wants us to become like Jesus in character. How do we become Jesus-like? God has a school with a faculty of

three teachers under the direction of the Spirit of Christ. When we trusted Christ the Holy Spirit moved into our hearts and began the business of changing us into Jesus-likeness.

The teachers are:

- 1. The Bible.
- 2. People—especially other students in the school.
- 3. Life circumstances.
 Someone has observed that of all the teachers God uses to grow us spiritually, He depends most on circumstances. Why?
 Because we face circumstances 24-7-365. And the circumstances almost always include people.

We will say more about the process of maturing as Christians in the 2023 Lenten series of messages.



Lent begins February 22nd—with Ash Wednesday

Lent for the year **2023** starts on Wednesday, February 22 and ends the evening of Thursday, April 6 with Holy Thursday.

Lent is a Christian annual period that starts on Ash Wednesday lasting for 40 days (not including Sundays) representing the 40 days Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness. This 40 day period for Christians is a time to reflect, fast, and give penance in preparation for the resurrection of Christ Easter Sunday.

Is Lent 40 days?

Lent for Christians starts on Ash Wednesday and ends on either the evening of Maundy Thursday or on sundown of Holy Saturday (day before Easter Sunday). However the practices of Lent do not end until sundown on Holy Saturday for all Christian denominations. So it is 44 days from Ash Wednesday to Maundy Thursday and another two days with Good Friday and Holy Saturday added to give a total of 46 days for Lent. But Sundays are excluded from fasting during Lent and with 6 Sundays removed from the count we get a 40 day liturgical period.

Keep watching for more information on the Lenten Study we will use this year at our Lenten Luncheons-and plan to attend!

Resurrection faith

In spring 2020, while Manhattan pastor Timothy Keller was writing a new book about Easter, the world — and his world — stopped. The coronavirus pandemic ravaged New York City, and Keller received a stage 4 cancer diagnosis. Suddenly the theologian had to confront death head-on and reassess his views on eternal life.

"I realized I only half-believed I was going to die," he tells *The Christian Post*. "In some ways, I also only half-believed in the Resurrection — not intellectually so much, but all the way down deep in my heart. I realized I needed to have a greater, a deeper faith in the Resurrection, both intellectually and mentally."

While undergoing cancer treatments, Keller took a deep dive into historical and scriptural evidence for Easter's main event. He also prayed that the Holy Spirit would make the Resurrection, which can seem abstract, real to his heart.

Facing your own mortality puts earthly things into clear perspective, says the pastor, and it's a wake-up call for Jesus' followers to act. "The Resurrection means that God has not at all given up on the world," Keller writes in *Hope in Times of Fear*. "But beyond that, it gives meaning to suffering and gives hope that through the suffering will come healing. The Resurrection guarantees that this renewal is certain and is also a call for Christians to work now against what is wrong and unjust."

Prove it!

In Jesus Christ, Superstar, King Herod mocks the bound prisoner who's brought to his courtyard. "So, you are the Christ. You're the great Jesus Christ!" he sings. "Prove to me that you're no fool: Walk across my swimming pool!"

Likewise, the Pharisees demand evidence that Jesus is speaking for God (see Matthew 12:38). It's easy to poke fun at them, but have you ever faced a tough decision and thought, "If only God would give me

a sign"?

Jesus tells the religious teachers about the "sign of Jonah," a metaphor for his upcoming death and resurrection. Though it's meant to be a sign for all, not everyone accepts it as truth. Luke 16:31 notes that if the rich man's brothers weren't predisposed to listen to Moses and the prophets, then "they will not be convinced even if someone rises from the dead" (NIV). Signs are useful only to people who accept their messages and act accordingly.

A God with scars

If anyone has ever asked you why a loving God allows suffering, you've probably developed a theodicy. That's a fancy word for defending belief in divine goodness despite evil's existence. Theologians who tackle this profound mystery note that God himself wasn't spared from pain. Despite his sinlessness as true God, Jesus endured crucifixion as true man. As proof of that sacrifice, his body was scarred.

Those marks feature in a poem by English pastor Edward Shillito. Seeing wounded combatants return from World War I, he wondered how the Gospel could seem like good news to them. When Shillito realized that Christianity alone features a God who suffered, he wrote "Jesus of the Scars" to offer comfort and hope. The poem concludes:

The other gods were strong; but thou wast weak; They rode, but thou didst stumble to a throne; But to our wounds only God's wounds speak; And not a god has wounds, but thou alone.
